Anna Mae Sjogren

Anna Mae Sjogren, age 91 of Northfield, passed away peacefully, with family by her side, on Thursday morning, July 27, 2023, at Evergreen Lodge of the Northfield Retirement Community.

Anna Mae (Wolford) Sjogren was born May 8, 1932, in Fox Lake, Minnesota to Wendell and Helen (Jorgensen) Wolford. She was raised in Welcome, Minnesota, and in 1951 graduated in the top 10 of her class (of 10) at Welcome High School. Following high school, she attended training at the Western Union Offices in Minneapolis for an automated operator and then worked at the Fairmont Railway Motors.

On September 14, 1952, Anna Mae married Roger Eric Sjogren at St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church (now St. Paul's UCC) in Welcome. After marriage, they traveled to Oklahoma while Roger served in the Army and was deployed to Panama Canal. After Roger got out of the Army, they made their home in Bloomington.

In 1961, they moved to a farm north of Northfield where they farmed crops. In 1963 they had a son - Karl Roger and in 1965 they had a daughter - Kristen Marie. In October 1969, they purchased the Hillcrest Motel in Northfield and operated it for over 25 years. In 2000, they sold the motel which later became the Manger Inn and is now currently Hillcrest Village. Roger passed away on May 6, 2002. In retirement, Anna Mae spent much of her time volunteering with the Northfield Hospital Auxiliary, the United Methodist Church, and Northfield Hospice.


